Arlene Anderson - Gourd Art

Our presenter for the February meeting will be Texas artist Arlene Anderson. Anderson has taken the ancient craft of gourd pyrography and elevated it into extraordinary fine art pieces. She accomplishes this through the means of pyroengraving and sculpting. Her passion for art and love of nature is revealed in these exceptional works of art. Every gourd is carefully selected for its durability and for the natural form that best expresses her unique artistic designs.

In her presentation, Anderson will be covering a wide range of topics pertinent to her art. Topics will include: the origin of gourd art, types and selection of gourds, the cleaning and preparatory processes, and necessary tools. She will also emphasize the techniques for designing unique art pieces including pyroengraving, carving, dyeing, and coatings. Anderson will bring a display of her exquisite pieces for our enjoyment and inspiration.

The media selections are diverse and include a total of eleven three-dimensional works. Almost half of the artists are Texans and the remaining entrants are residents of twenty-two other states. Six VAST members were juried into the show: Lorraine J. Hayes, Robin Butt, Dave Maxwell, Fran White Shurtleff, Amy Schnoll, and Carolyn Riegelman. 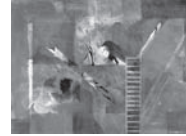

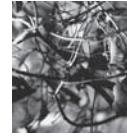

VAST Gala A Magical Evening

On Friday, January 20, 250 people gathered to honor watercolor painter Rob Erdle with a magnificent tribute. Our guests came from throughout the metroplex: many artists whose painting careers and lives have been imprinted with Rob's teaching and friendship, faculty and administration from the UNT School of Visual Arts, the UNT Provost, and Mayor Eulene Brock. As Becca Hines said: "What a good time everyone had last night! What a wonderful tribute to Rob. He wanted a quiet night with friends, music, and candlelight. We succeeded in meeting all of his wishes [and more]. The audience was filled with people who came to listen and to enjoy him, who appreciated what he has accomplished as an artist and recognized the contributions he has made to the lives of many, many people across the world."

If it was as Becca suggests, it is because we had a marvelous group of people, both in and out of VAST, who worked together with the same goal of creating a classy, elegant, and warm evening. The food from Asian restaurants in Denton was excellent. The guests were mesmerized by the exquisite performances by UNT doctoral music students Hsiao-Lan Wang, yangchin, and Jing Wang, erhu, who played traditional Chinese folk music. Dr. James Scott, Dean of the UNT College of Music, accompanied Jing on the piano for one of her pieces. Dr. Cindy McTee, a UNT College of Music composition professor, worked closely with the performers.

Rob's lecture, illustrated with fascinating slides documenting his eleven visits to China over thirteen years, was incisive and witty. Eight pieces from Rob's opening exhibition of 47 works (paintings and photographs) were sold Friday night – quite a record for the CVA. The exhibit is stunning and very interesting – it will be up until March 3 (Tuesday-Sunday, 1-5).



The VAST steering committee members developed terrific ideas to shape the evening. In addition, they contributed countless hours in the days before the gala: Carolyn Riegelman coordinated volunteers and ran all sorts of errands; Jo Williams installed the exhibition and prepared materials about the photographs for gallery viewers; and Lynne Cagle was constantly available fielding last-minute decisions and turning out essentials with her amazing computer skills.
